so purchased is to belong to my
wife and I have given
the discretion of my executors

to their benefit so soon as my
youngest child becomes of age what
property that may be left shall be
personal, I will it shall be
equally divided between my wife
and Rose Children each an equal
share, I nominate and appoint
my beloved wife, Phoebe Shetty
executrix and my trusty friend
John Sedford Executor of this my
last will and Testament.
