and memory, thanks be to God for his mercy, do dis-
pose of my worldly goods, that He hath bestowed on
me in the following manner (and first to my
beloved wife Mary Davis all the household furniture
together with half the stock of cattle, with the Road
ward, and three of her cattle, and forty dollars
that is in the hands of John Six. And secondly
to my son Luke I give the other half of the cattle
with the remainder of the horse creatures, and
the land that I live on.

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And thirdly, I leave to my son John, one
Dollar.
Fourthly, I give to David my son one Quarter
Dollar. Fifthly I give to my Daughter, Nancy
one Quarter Dollar; Sixthly, I give to my son
Joseph one Quarter Dollar. Seventhly, I give
my Daughter Mary one Quarter Dollar. Eighthly
I give to my son Aba, one Quarter Dollar.
Ninthly, I give to my Daughter Dorcas one
Quarter Dollar, and I do allow my wife
Mary to be my Administratrix. And I do
hereby declare all former Wills, as witness
my hand this 13th day of May 1801.

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their bond in the penalty of ninety pounds
Condition for her due and faithful Adminis-
tration of the said Decedent's Estate and perform-
ance of his will. And thereupon a probate thereof
