In the name of God. Amen, I, Joseph
 Williams of Montgomery County and State
 of Kentucky being inspired in body but
 of weak memory thank God, and
 long to remembrance the uncertainty of life
 and that all flesh must yield to Death
 when God shall please to call, I do make
 and ordain this my last will and testa-
 ment, in manner and form following:
 Revoking all others made by me in
 either by word or writing and this is to
 be taken for my last will and testament
 and first I commit my soul to him
 who by God, and my body to be buried
 in decent burial by my executor
 as mentioned, As for my temporal
 estate I wish my debts should be dis-
 posed of in the following manner (Viz)
 First I wish that all my just debts
 shall be discharged, I leave and bequeath
 to my Son James and Samuel Wil-
 son all my land in Bath Brothers
 County, to be equally divided between
 them James William to share
 on that side of that river
 he now lives, I leave and bequeath to my
 Daughter Jane Bailey one Dollar
 I leave and bequeath to my Son-in-law
 Symon Blackhouse one Dollar
 I leave and bequeath to my Daugh-
 ter Margaret, Houtman two hundred
