My Negro boy named Henry except what shall hereafter be mentioned during her natural life in widowhood, but if she sees cause to change her life by way of marriage and is no more my Widow, she then and if land taking with her, her bed with all her clothes, her saddle and bridle with all her dishes & furniture and Cupboard with tea kettle and aquapung with all her pots with two of the chairs of y^e bays also with four of her kine of y^e sheep, spinning wheel and check reel, likewise five pounds for y^e y^e and third in money of other we have in trade at the hereafter mentioned time her value during her natural life and no longer, I give and bequeath to my well beloved son James Baldwell fifty acres of land on y^e east of my after said land from y^e one side to y^e other as his part in full. I give and bequeath unto my beloved son John Baldwell y^e place he now lives on as his part in full. I give and bequeath to my well beloved son Oliver Baldwell y^e plantation at

126 On I now dwell after her mother Marys decease but not till he arrives at the age of thirtynity, but his said mother is still to enjoy y^e said possession while she lives if her Widowhood continues, son Oliver is to have one horse bridle and saddle as his part in full - and when Oliver him self hath received her part

I give and bequeath to my well beloved daughter Mary Baldwell one good horse or Mare at y^e value of 100 dollars her saddle and bridle with her bed & bolster with all her clothes and clothing with my desk & sugar desk & looking glass & spinning wheel likewise while she remains unmarried she shall have a decent living off the land I now live on & likewise have her y^e rooming next side of my new house to live in during her single life & no longer but if Oliver sees cause to sell and remove to another part of the land, she may go with him & he must furnish her in a convenient way of living but if she should see cause to change her life by way of marriage or any other way to live she may take with her two of

of her choice of ye heirs and whome
 I am Alexander hath received her
 part in full, I likewise dispose in
 ye following manner and form, to wit
 after my wifes marriage or decease the
 my negro man Samud Henry shall enjoy
 his full freedom & receive a good suit of
 clothes of ye whole heire, I likewise
 that after my Wifes marriage or
 decease that all ye moveable Effects shall
 be sold to ye best advantage as my
 Execution shall be caused only my Executors
 I am I leave that to my three sons
 James, Robert & Oliver and all the remain-
 der of my moveable effects to be Equally
 divided between them, (Wife & Son)
 And I do nominate and appoint my
 three trusty friends David Alexander,
 Robert Long and James Herring to be
 my Executors of this my last will and
 Testament revoking and disannulling all
 other Wills or bequestments by me
 heretofore made ratifying and confirming
 this and no other to be my last will

testament. In Witness whereof I have here-
 unto set my hand & seal ye day & year first
 above said
 Signed sealed, published, pronounced &
 declared in presence of us
 and at least any heat or out breaking should
 arise among one or either of them I shall
 make choice of three good Justices, viz,
 Andrew English, James Herring, and
 Joseph Long if any two of them agree
 it must finally stand in preference of
 the whole family. I likewise allow all my
lots to be sold and all my debt to be paid
