 and my body to be buried in a Christian like
 manner - Also by these presents constitute
 make and declare this my last will and
 Testament in manner and form following
 To wit: First I will and my just and lawful
 debts to be discharged out of my estate -
 Then I give, devise and bequeath to my
 wife Elizabeth Mitchell for her lifetime -
 also one third of all my personal property
 to be disposed of at the same time to wit:
 Then I give and bequeath to my son
 Robert all this land upon which
 I now live, saveing to my wife what is
 above named, also I give him my wagon
 and gear and all my farming utensils
 likewise the use of all the stock on the
 farm for the support of the family
 Then I give and bequeath to my sons
 Matthew and James all my upper purchase

purchase where my son Matthew now lives,
 to be equally divided between them if my
 son James does not chuse to take the same.
 Then Matthew is to have the whole of it
 and to pay James two hundred Dollars
 in cash - I give to James the horse which
 is called to him - My three youngest
 daughters are to be at the discretion of
 my Executors & particularly my will is to be
 had to my daughter Rachel about the
 age of two on account her infirmities -
 To my grand son Archibald Ramsey
 I will and bequeath the sum of twenty pounds
 which I have and do owe together worth
 fourteen Dollars, also I bequeath out of
 bounty under which all to be added
 to him when he comes of age -
 To my son John Mitchell & daughters
 Janet & Martha I give six shillings each.
 I appoint my wife Elizabeth Mitchell
 my Executors and Robert Mitchell & James
 Joseph Executors - This I acknowledge and
 Ratify as my last Will and Testament made
 this

for the true and faithful administration of
the said Decedent's estate & performance of his
Will, & that they gave a probate thereof as
required them in due form.
