 Will and Testament and none
 other and to Purcede: First of all
 my lawfull debts to be paid out
 of my moveable Property. I also will

 until said girl arrives the age of
 twenty years and then said girl to
 be free to all intents and purposes.

I now live on ailing heretofore, and then to
Return to my old home, I will to my son
Deborah Cantrell a unity six acres of
Land whereon he now lives with all the
Surplus Land between his line and Smith's
Simple Survey, I will to my son
Joshua Cantrell the Land he now lives on
Beginning at Brackens corner on the
bank of State and Running South with
Brackens and Williams line to the River
thence up the River to the mill seat, thence
up the back line to the old line, I also
reserve five acres out of this for the use of
all my children to build a mill on
I also will to my son William Cantrell
my Land on the East side of State, adjoining
of Deblong unity six acres, and then
Wadlows land also I will him my Badley
Tract, I will to my son Lacy Cantrell
my Farmyard with all Tracts belonging
thereto with all the Land from Linches
line down to my meadow fence, by a straight
and South line and one hundred and twenty
acres of Land on the Long Branch part of a
Survey bought of Peyton Short
