 and State of Kentucky being Sick and Weak in
 Body but of perfect mind and memory do make
 and Ordain this my Last Will and Testament. --
 First I Recommend my Soul to God that gave it
 and my body to the earth to be buried in Decent
 manner at the Discretion of my Executors and
 of touching such Worldly Estate which with
 it has pleased God to bless me in this life. --
 I gave Possession and Dispose of the same in the
 following manner and form One Thousand
 Acres of Land lying in Russell County and State
 of Virginia to be Sold by my Executors and
 equally Divided among my seven Children
 including the one not yet born. Also I Will that
 the Land I now live on, if obtained, be sold
 by my Executors and Divided as above or the
 money arising from said Sales to be
 divided Equally Little Henry Elizabeth Elizabeth
 Bailey and Lewis with the Exception above mentioned
 I gave and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth
 One black Mare Saddle and Bridle. the remaining
 part of my Horse with my Little Sheep & Hogs
 I Give may be sold by my Executors and the
 money Divided as above Directed excepting
 One Mare Saddle and Bridle I Give
 Little Henry that he now claims I also gave
 my beloved wife One bed and furniture One
 Pewee with One Basin and four plates One
 Case of Knives and forks One pot & Oven

One Coffee Pot set of Cups and Saucers
 The remaining part of my household furniture
 I Will that it be sold and the money and
 as above directed also that my Book
 Accounts with notes bonds and judgments
 may be collected by my Executors and
 as above directed I Will that my negro
 Girl Deliah be sold at the highest bid
 for twelve months at a time till my Daughter
 Elizabeth Bailey shall be twelve years of Age and
 the money to be appropriated to the use of Raising
 my three Youngest Children always including
 the one not yet born then I Will that the said
 negro be sold and the money equally divided
 amongst all my Children I Will that Six pounds
 each of my Estate go to the use of schooling my
 three Youngest Children. And Lastly I Ordain and
 appoint my beloved wife Elizabeth Mayberry and
 my beloved son Joe Mayberry my Executor and
 Executors of this my last Will and Testament and
 I do hereby Revoked all and every will or Wills
 heretofore by me made in Writing when of Sound
 mind set my hand and Seal this second Day
 of April in the Year of our Lord One
 Thousand seven hundred and Ninety eight
