Thousand Eight Hundred and Four, I Margaret
Robertson of the County of Montgomery and
State of Kentucky being in perfect mind and
good memory of calling to mind the mortal-
ality of Body and knowing that it is appoint-
ed for all men once to die do make and
ordain this my Last Will and Testament
Viz. Principally and first of all I give
and recommend my Soul into the Hands
of Almighty God who gave it and my
Body I recommend to the Earth to be buried
in a decent Christian manner at the
discretion of my Executors nothing doub-
ing but at the General Resurrection I
shall receive the same again by the
mighty power of God and as touching
such worldly Estate as it hath pleased

that is for me I do allow all my debts
and Funeral Expenses to be paid out of

my Estate I do Will Bequeath to my daughter Jean Forty dollars which is to be her full share.

And I do Will and Bequeath to my son in Law William Moffatt Two dollars which is now in his hands also Forty five dollars in his hands to my Daughter Rebecca Moffatt which is to be their full share.

3^d I do Will and Bequeath to the Heirs of my Son John Robertson de. Twenty dollars to be Equally divided amongst them this to be their share.

4th I do Will and Bequeath to my Son in Law John Groves and daughter & legal heirs between them Fifty pounds Pennsylvania Currency also a large Family Bible this to be their full share.

5th I do Will and Bequeath to my Grand daughter Ruth One hundred dollars Cash now in the hands of my Brother William Hornblow and my Dear Grace the furniture Belonging to it also a Day Wheel and a small quantity of Cloths this to be her full share.

I do by this my last Will and Testament constitute and ordain John Groves my Executor in this my last Will and Testament.
