 Dewitt, & Paul Dewitt all my wearing
 cloths and all my utensils of every kind
 to be equally divided amongst them after my
 decease. I then I give unto my son Paul
 Dewitt the purchase of my plantation
 whereon I now live, by giving his sister the
 one third of what grain is raised on it
 during her life yearely, and that my son
 Henry Dewitt is to take care his mother is
 well served, and that my beloved wife shall
 buy and possess all the rest of my estate during
 her life, and after her decease then for it to
 be equally divided amongst my six children
 Mary Williamson, Peter Dewitt, Hannah Glen,
 Henry Dewitt, Sarah Rice, and Paul
 Dewitt, And lastly I hereby appoint my two
 sons Peter Dewitt & Henry Dewitt my exors.

And sole Executors of this my last will and
 Testament disavowing all other Will or Wills before
 mentioned, Ratifying and Confirming this to be my
 last In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 and seal the day and Date above written

 acknowledge a bond in the penal sum of
 \$1000000 to Law and thereupon to be
 granted them in due form as the Law
 directs &c

my lawfull debts to be paid out
