Weak in body but sound in mind do
make and ordain this my last will
testament. Item I wish to resign my
Soul to him that first gave it whenever
he may think proper to remove it.
Item 2. I bid to my Dr Wife Eliza Kilkinson
the tract of Land whereon I now live with
all my household furniture. Attention to
and all my stock of horses cattle sheep
hogs during her natural life. Item 3. All my
Land in Binton County I direct to be sold
when all my Children shall become of age
for the best price which can be had and
the Money's Equally divided among my Dr
Item 4. I direct my four youngest son and two
Daughters to have given them a good English
Education and that a fund may be sufficient
for their support and schooling
that four of my negroes be hired
for that price which can be had when
as follows (viz) Leannah Mesback,
Pedrigo Brown, and should the fund
be sufficient I direct that Money
may be made up to pay for their schooling
in that way which will do the best

to my Estate. Item 5. I bid to my beloved
Wife above named the whole of my negroes
beside those I have directed to be hired out
during her life. Item 6. I direct that my son Henry have fifty
five Dollars paid to him out of the moneys
due me, Item 7. At my Dr Wife's
Desire I give unto my Dr Sheldon all
my Estate real and personal which is to
be Equally divided so that each one of
them shall have an equal portion.
Item 8. I direct after my four youngest
sons Education shall be completed and
should their mother decess before they
shall come to age, that they shall be
brought to some tradesman, or Farmer as
they may choose of good fame and
moral character and I direct that my
two Daughters should their mother decess
before they come to age live with
my Dr John Sarah Glover and their
Dr and I do appoint my son William
Kilkinson my Executor to this last will
and testament hoping and relying that
he will faithfully discharge his duty in
executing the directions of this my last will
according to his best abilities and such Court
as may be required.

Make and publish this my last Will and
Testament that is to say principally I give of
all I give and recommend my soul into the

I recommend it to God earth to be buried
in a Christian and decent like manner
at the direction of my Executors nothing
doubting, but at the General resurrection
I shall receive the same again by the al-
mighty power of God, and as touching
the said Estate wherewith it hath pleased
God to bless me in this life I give and
devise and dispose of ye. same in ye
following manner and form, First I give
and bequeath to my just debts to be paid,
I give and bequeath to my well beloved
wife Jean Baldwin ye West side of ye
Plantation whereon I now live allowed
to be 180 acres with all my improve-
ments house hold furniture & farming
utensils with my stock of Cattle with

Iacob & Morris & William Morris Surv' all the money
 arising from the sale of my Land above mentioned to be
 equally divided between them live to them and their
 heirs for ever. And I give unto the rest of Children
 one Shilling Sterling money to each of them to be paid
 them by the last of I constitute make & confirm my
 son Jacob Morris &c. of this my last will & testament
 And I do hereby utterly disavow and revoke all
 former wills legacies bequest &c. by me in
 any wise before mentioned & bequeathed & certify
 & confirming this & no other to be my last will and
 testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my
 hand and seal the 24 Day of March in the
 year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred & four
 signed sealed published &c. William Morris
 declared in presence of

 Susanah Ralls
 Montgomery County. November Court 1806
 The last will and testament of William Morris
