I Peter Honaker of Montgomery County Kentucky being in a declining State of Body but of perfect mind and memory and calling to Remembrance that it is appointed unto men to die do make and ordain this my last will & Testament and give Reman to my dear body to the dust from whence I came & my soul into the hands of God that gave it And I do give & bequeath that the the ^{money} of the said will or estate receive thereof & again the Resurrection of the Dead

and as for such worldly Estate as
has pleased God to bestow on me with
Agree and desire of the same in
the manner following Viz First
I Give and bequeath to Mary my
faithfull and well beloved wife
the possession and enjoyment of all
my estate real and personal during
life or widowhood and in Case of her
marriage I desire that all my then
and moveable property of every descrip-
tion (except such as I now or hereinafter
disposed of) be sold and the money
equally divided among my children
Viz Molly Ellen John Martin
James & Charles Wesley as they become
of age according to Law.
Secondly My desire is
that my Negro Mares Liz live
with and serve my wife during
the life of my wife and in Case of
the death of my wife Liz shall
not be sold nor considered as
property to be disposed of but the
said Liz shall have free liberty
to chuse which of my Children
she will live with and the

said Liz shall live with and serve
that one and none other during her
life and if the said Negro Mares have
any Children they shall not be separated
from her but shall live with her
until they shall be judged fit for ser-
vice by my Executors and then they shall
be hired out until they arrive at the age
of twenty five years and the hire shall
be divided among my Children as they
arrive at the age of twenty five years and
when said Negro Children shall arrive
at the age of twenty five years I do hereby
liberate and manumit and discharge
said Negro Children from any longer
service and declare that they shall
thereafter be free to all intents &
purposes although I myself had lived
to execute an instrument of Emancipation
and I do hereby solemnly require and
charge my Children and Executors not
to keep the said Negro Children in
bondage any longer than the above
named time and I do further charge
my Executors to be particular in the
execution of this part of my last will
and testament. Thirdly In Case of the
death of my wife before my sons
arrive at age I desire that my sons
shall be put to service and the

discretion of the surviving Executors
and I desire in such case that
my lands be rented out and the
money put to interest untill my
youngest child arrive at age
and I desire that my lands may be
sold or due debts as may be paid
test by my Executors and the rent
money arising from the sale of my
lands be divided (as it be convenient)
equally among my children

Finally and Lastly I do hereby nomi-
nate appoint and constitute my true
and well beloved wife Mary Mon-
ter to be my executrix and my true
friends Charles Welladay and John
Evans to be my joint Executors with
my wife of this my last will and
testament and discharging all for-
mills & Testaments or Executions dooing
noe Sledge and accord and declare this
only to be my last will and testamen-
t and the above named persons to be
my only proper and lawful Executors
In testimony whereof I have
hereunto set my hand this 10th
day of August anno domini 1798
