Kentucky, being of full age and sound mind and memory, think he good
and lawful to dispose of my Estate and knowing that it is appointed for
all men to die, do make and Ordain as follows

My Last Will and Testament, That is to say, I give and bequeath my soul
into the hands of Almighty God that gave it and my
body I Recommend to the Earth. And as touching
such Worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased God
to bless me in this life, I give, devise and dispose of
the same in the following manner and Form

First that all my Just debts of what kind soever
be properly adjusted and paid by my Executors
Second I give and bequeath unto my Son
Daniel Williams, one hundred and fifty
Acres of Land part of my Survey of four
hundred and ninety five Acres or thereabouts.
One Young woman named Grace Kitty, the
daughter of a and formerly a slave to me.

Thirdly, I give and bequeath unto my
Daughter Mary the feather Bed and
the Blankets. Fourthly I give and bequeath
my saddle to John W. Wheeler
Fifthly I give and bequeath the Remainder
of my personal Estate of what kind soever
my beloved wife Sarah during her life,
widowhood. Sixthly after the natural death
or widowhood of my beloved wife Sarah, my
Estate be equally divided between Benjamin
Thomas, J. Williams, Jesse Williams, Reptha
Whelan, Daniel Williams (young) and
Nancy Williams, Lastly I do constitute
