and money thanks be given unto God, calling
unto mind the mortality of my Body & knowing
that it is appointed for all men once to die, do
make and ordain this my last will and testament
that as touching such worldly estate wherewith
I am possessed I give to Belemus in this life
I give, demise, and Dispose of the same in the
following manner and form

I give and bequeath to my
very beloved wife Dwelling house one third
of the plantation, two Negroes named Dick
and Wot for life time; and all farming utensils
and stock to carry on her farms and at her
decease the two Negroes stock and furniture
and a quantity with Rebecca Batoranah
I give to my very well beloved son Thomas
one Bond on Asa Davis of one
and Pounds & one Dick three Negroes
and one, George and John and all my

my very well beloved Daughter Ann Fletcher
one bond named Paul, one bond named
furniture and that to be bound and in
of Anne Fletcher her Mother to be
in majority Requires

Witness

the 13th Day of March 1799

Also I give to my Daughter Mary Moore one
 Virgin girl and Quinton Moore to have his
 Dues for two hundred acres of Land

Also I give my Daughter Rachel Landster
 one Virgin Boy named him and Joseph Landster
 a Dues for one hundred acres of Land

Also I give my Daughter Rebecca Fletcher
 one Virgin girl named Filtone Moore and
 saddle Bed and furniture

Also I give my Daughter Catherine Fletcher
 one Virgin girl named her one horse and saddle
 Bed and furniture

Also I give my Daughter Ruth Fletcher one
 Virgin girl to be given out of the Estate one horse
 and saddle Bed and furniture

Also Dan Sweeney is to have one hundred and
 fifty acres of Dues to him of land where
 Samuel Sweeney lived

 constitute make and Ordain the sole Executors
 of this my last will and Testament all and

 utterly swallow, Revok and Disannul all and
 Every other former Testament Legacies Will

 named Will. Bequeathed, Ratifying and Confirming
 this and no other to be my last will and Testament
 In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
 hand and seal this 14th Day of May 1799
