First, I will that all my Lawful Debts be paid, out of my personal Estate — also I will to my son Robert and his heirs, the place I now live upon, provided he make a right by DEED to my son Samuel of a tract of land I gave him, lying on the waters of Flat Creek — also I bequeath to my son William & his heirs, a tract of land lying on M^r Colurs run, a branch of Hays Fork, in Bourbon County consisting of one hundred & seventy one acres — Likewise Fifty pounds in cash — Also I bequeath to my Daughters, Mary, Sally & Jenny, Fifty pounds each in cash. Likewise I bequeath to my said Daughters, in

property, or money— Also I will that my sons Thomas & Robert, give to my sons William & Samuel, a Horse & creature, to each out of the estate, three years from the present time to be worth Twenty pounds each, by valuation. Also I will that the remainder of my estate be equally divided among all my surviving sons and Daughters. Also I will constitute and appoint my sons Thomas & Robert Metter, my Executors, in trust of this my last will and Testament. — I WILL IN WITNESS
I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal to this my last will the day and year above written.
