 within my opinion, a bed and furniture, a
 bow and staff, a saw and fags and twenty dollars
 in specie - the same to be delivered to him when
 he shall arrive at the age of twenty one years.
 The balance, or residue of my estate, both real
 and personal I leave to my beloved wife -
 Milly Ragan during her natural life or widowhood

widowhood, and at her death or marriage, the same to be equally divided among my children ^{living} ~~except~~ my son Charles, who is provided for. Lastly I appoint my beloved wife Milly and my son Charles Executors of this my last Will and Testament.
