and myself to almighty god from whom I
am — and with regard to my estate, that I
have pleased god to be his mo will I give
and bequeath in manner and for as follows
I give & bequeath to my beloved wife Sarah
Said all my estate both real and personal
I also a power for estate and sole executor
to this will during her life and at her death to be
equally divided between my five children that
are now living with me. To-wit: Eliza Smith
Susan said Eliza said James said and
Lucy said and be it remembered that I have
disposed of part of the tract within & above
containing six or thereabouts which I
have desired to have a portion in the way of
died of age it having gone through the hands
John the said who married my daughter

He received the greater of the said as a gift from me
then I give to my other daughter a small my said debt
on said from the possession of my said debt to
Lamphell & Lida Thompson the said in like man-
ner to each twenty shillings then I give and bequeath
unto my daughter Sally the my forty acres of land
where she now lives at the house of my wife
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
affixed my seal this twenty six day of April eighteen
hundred and five
