ined all the legal vouchers in relation thereto. Report that the last of
purpuse sold of the Estate of Benjamin Tompkins Dec'd amounted to £16
10/6 of which Henry Sewster became purchaser to the amount of £10/10/0
and will sell to the amount of £2/10/0 each had as appears to our satis-
faction together with his securities for the payment of the same
reported from this Commission with to a County unknown to said
Administrator before he could have collected the same by Law or other
means which said £10/10/0 bought by said Henry Tompkins the man
of said Benjamin Tompkins which to the £2/10/0 bought by said Will
amounts to £12/10/0. Which cleared from the above £16/10/6 leaves
a balance of £4/0/6 equal to 25 1/2 p.cents. We report further that
the legal vouchers presented to said Administrator to be paid and by
him discharged out of the funds of said estate amount to \$111/02 which
deduction from from the above \$16/75 leaves a balance due by the
said Administrator of \$4/90. We further report that the said
James Barclay has been at great trouble and expense in collecting
and transmitting the claims of Administrator to the Estate of
Benjamin Tompkins Dec'd and for which we have made him no
