State of Kentucky aged about forty five years being in above state of health
but of a sound mind considering the certainty of death, and the uncertainty
of the time it may happen have determined to make this my
will and testament in manner following. Viz. after my
death I wish all my debt speedily paid when legally demanded
and proper vouchers produced. I also wish the debt due me speedily
collected. Item I give and bequeath to my beloved wife the three
hundred acres of land whereon I now live which is decreed to me by
Weather Smith during her natural life, and at her death my share
is that the above three hundred acres be equally divided between my sons John
and Robert allowing to Robert his moiety off the most northern
side, to be laid off in the best shape the nature of the case will
admit so as to include the spring and building, and further give
and bequeath to my wife Malinda and Maria and her children
any of my horses or mares together with her saddle and bridle
bed and furniture two silver table spoons, twelve (12) one
half of my earthen ware and knives and forks and one table two
flag bottoms Churn her share off her head of Cattle Cows except
one and five head of sheep during life, and at her death with the interest
I wish to be equally divided among my children as herein after provided.
Item I give and bequeath to my two eldest daughters Amy
Jane and Jane Smith the tract of land decreed to me by Charles D
Smith to be equally divided ^{between them} allowing to Amy Jane Thomas her moiety
off the end of the survey between Robert & Jane now living. Item
I give and bequeath to my son Benjamin Franklin Thomas
George Washington Thomas the land which I claim by virtue
of a bond which I hold on Weather Smith and to be equally
divided between them according to quantity and quality.
I do hereby request my Executors to procure title to the said land
from the said Weather Smith as soon as the nature of the
will admit. And whereas I do have acres of land on
which title by deed from James ^{here} and it is my wish

which has arrived to my other children I intend
that my Executors will purchase at a fair price one
lot or more adjoining the same lot of that cannot be
done they will purchase to rent the above tract of Land until at
some convenient time not long before my daughter Eliza arrives and
then whether or whether she shall arrive at age see the same
and out of any money, not allow me appropriate purchase for
cash of these one hundred and fifty acres as near in point of
value as may be to the other slaves - and it is further my
will and desire that all my personal property and negroes shall
be valued except those already disposed of by James & Co
Messrs James & Co and that books or any other of them at
a value in the common way of valuing estates, there being first
an order Court legally appointing them and request they will
make report thereof to the next Court themselves, and at my
last I bequeath to my son Marcus one eighth part of the
estate property or be valued and the balance of my personal
property negroes excepted I wish to be sold and a deed of
such months and at my children arrives at age I wish
them to receive their shares of the negroes value in the
same way that Marcus receives his, and the balance in
Curl so as to make their share equal to his, and so soon
as my youngest child shall arrive at the age of twenty one
year, I wish whatever property and money remains together with
my wife's dower and whatever increase of property there may
be equally divided among my children - My intention is
that my children shall be educated out and schooled
(Marcus excepted) till the age of sixteen, at which time
my son is to be bound out to some trade at the direction
of the Executors or Guardians - and to prevent any difficulties
that might arise about the age of my children I wish
to name their names and age to this will - And I
further request and desire that my children may get their
dividend of this estate in very small lots not above one provided
for my son at the age of twenty one year and my daughter
at the age of eighteen - of my will further is

37 that all my negroes shall be hired out except Ed Hannock
who is to live with my wife or any of my children that she may
choose and to be paid by my Executors or Guardians the dollar
annually out of any money, their hands. It is to be understood
that the debts due me together with the money on hand
and that ^{these} ~~these~~ property of mine now by me are not to be consumed
any part of the personal property - to be valued by the Court
if any debt to remain in the hands of my Executors to be dis-
posed of after paying my last debts together with a portion
money arising from the hire of negroes and such as
to interest and the purchase of negroes or negroes as my heirs
I wish shall think most for the advantage of the estate - And whereas
my son Edmund will not by the appropriation in this will
more than one eighth division of this estate it is my will that he
shall pay over to the other legatees as they arrive at age his share
of the same and that he give security to be accepted of by the Court
for the payment of the same before he receive title to the same
decreed to him in this will. It is further my will that if any
of my children should depart this life before they arrive at age
or have any lawful issue that their property bequeathed by
me together with the increase of negroes shall return to
their Brothers and Sisters to be equally divided among them
as the ~~one~~ ^{one} at the age above mentioned - And further I
have devised over all trading done among my children and
others to be purchased the share of each to be carried off to him
or her whom, when they shall arrive at age - It is my
will and desire that when any one of my sons shall arrive

is to have his share immediately on my decease and my
daughter at the age of eighteen, that he or she or her heirs
if she be married apply to the County Court of Montgomery
County for the appointment of a Commissioner to lay off
to him or her, his or her share of land which he or she may
be entitled to by this will and the Commissioner so appointed
