I also give and bequeath to my son in law James Foster one Dollar. I also give and bequeath to John Foster Billy Foster Mary Foster Sally Foster Thomas Foster John Foster my grand & children one Dollar apiece to be paid by my executors when they become of age. They being heirs of my daughter Jane Foster. I also give and bequeath to Joseph Thompson my son in law the twenty acres of land before reserved it being the place where he now lives on the west end of my tract. I also further give and bequeath to all my children hereafter named all the remainder of my property to be ^{equally divided} amongst them (that is to say) Joseph Jones Thomas Jones Elizabeth Thomas John Jones Francis Jones Mary Jones Thompson Billy Thompson and Benjamin Jones and last further ~~an~~ remembered that my son Joseph Jones has received eighty eight Dollars which is part of his legacy. Also my son in law Joseph Thompson has received seventy eight Dollars as part of his legacy.
