the S.E. corner of the 100 acres and run with the line
of the same West 56 poles to a stake Elm and Boxelder at
said line at 2. Thence North 100 poles to a blunty tree
on the North boundary line of said 100 acres survey at 3.
Thence with said line East 56 poles to an Elm at C. 4
being the N.E. corner of said 100 acre survey Thence with
the line of the same South 100 poles to the Beginning
