Patterson and James Harrow except the slave Bartlett who is so estimated and charged to James Morton and we severally and respectively bind and oblige ourselves, and our Hurs. to stand to and abide by the distribution when made by the Gentlemen aforesaid with the exception of Bartlett who is valued and charged to James Morton, aforesaid, the others are all to be valued and distributed and the whole to be made equal; those who receive more ~~than~~ ^{than} an average lot to pay such as receive less ~~than~~ ^{than} an average lot unless each lot shall be made equal. The several sums that may be to be paid to bear interest from the date and payable six months after date.
