Item 5 I do bequeath unto each of my sons when they are at the age of Eighteen and each of my daughters when they are at the age of sixteen & good & lawful adults. Item 6 Should one or more of my children die before they become of age the portion allotted to them shall be given equally divided amongst the surviving.
