before he comes to the age of turning one then in that
case it is my will that the of aforesaid four hundred
dollars should descend to John Ramsey son of my Brother
James Ramsey and his heirs forever then unto my
nephew David Ramsey and his heirs I give and bequeath
in perpetuity the land with the plantation which
I bought of Thomas & Garrett and G. Garrett bought
of James Meloy peremptory possession at my
decease containing one hundred Eleven three
quarters and one third eighth poles also the other
fourth part of my home tract of land not
hereof or bequeathed at the decease of my wife
also the balance of the other half of my stock of
every description house hold and Kitchen Furniture
together with the produce now on hand of every
description except the of aforesaid four hundred dollars
hereof or bequeathed to her unto my nephew David
Ramsey and his heirs I give and bequeath one half of
my money by me together with one half of the notes in
different people also some open accounts which may
hereafter be collected all of which he is to receive
immediately after my decease lastly I constitute
and appoint my wife Letty Ramsey my nephew
David Ramsey executors and executors of this will and
Testament and as it will be seen in the point of this
Instrument or Will the cause I have taken to disposing
of what little I have been blessed with in this world
it may make some person or persons envious to
bother or delay this Instrument or Will therefore it is
my wish and desire that any person or persons so
attempting it may not succeed nor find any
favor in any Court of Justice in the Commonwealth
of Kentucky for Witnesses of all and of each of the

In the name of God amen I James Hannah of
Montgomery County Kentucky being very sick and weak
in body but of perfect mind and memory thank be to
God calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing
that it is appointed for all men once to die do make
and ordain this my last will and Testament that is to say
primarily and first of all I give and recommend my
soul to God that gave it and my body to be buried in
decent Christian burial at the discretion of my executors
and as touching such worldly estate which I have by God
to bless me with I give and dispose of the same in the
following manner and form first it my will that all
my just debts and funeral charges be paid
secondly I give and bequeath to my beloved wife
Elizabeth Hannah one half of the land between the
line of John Leckridge and John Hannah extending
north to the descent line during her natural life
and at her decease to fall to my two sons Robert
Hannah and Samuel Hannah and also it is my will that
she shall have all my Household Furniture and stock
of Horses cattle and Sheep Thirdly I give and bequeath
to my two sons Robert Hannah and Samuel Hannah
the other half of the afore mentioned tract of land
West of the first mentioned moiety and last
of John Hannah one fourth I give bequeath
to my son John Hannah viz one of land lying
West of my first purchase beginning at a boundary

marked as a corner thence Eastwardly up the branch
 1stly poles to a Stake thence North 160 poles to a buckeye
 and also thence East 60 poles to a Hickory and white
 thence thence South 160 poles to the beginning making
 60 acres including the purchase of 20 acres of John
 Harrah from the heirs of Cadwalader Jones Eighty

 of just rate land in the State of Indiana
 provided her husband Robert Harrah together

 to be collected or paid Monthly it is my will to give
