part. Item 3rd After my youngest daughter named Caroline shall

be come of age I wish my landed property to be sold on a credit of twelve

months and the proceeds equally divided amongst my children

whose names are as follows. To wit. John & Eliza & Maria

Anna & Benjamin & Henry and Caroline the youngest. Item 4th

After my death I wish the stock except what may be necessary

for the support of my present plantation to be sold on a credit of

twelve months and the proceeds

Item 5th I do bequeath unto each of my sons when they arrive at the

age of eighteen and each of my daughters when they arrive at the age

of sixteen & good settled skills. Item 6th Should one or more of

my children die before they become of age the portion allotted to the same

shall be given equally divided amongst the surviving. In witness

whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 2nd day of April

in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and sixteen

This instrument of writing purporting to be the last will & testament
