as designated in the plat by the letters A B C D - the Fig.
1 that part claimed by the heirs of William Mills Dead
Fig. 2 that part of said survey allotted by the Commis-
sioners to the aforesaid Stephen Ellison and Barbara
his wife as the right of dower of the original survey
which part contain sixty acres Fig. 3 that part
conveyed to James Berry by the said James Mills
Dead - all which is shown and may be seen by the
original notes Mildred looks to.

The letters A B C D the original survey under which James
Mills held Fig. 1 that part claimed by William
Mills heirs Fig. 2 the part allotted to Barbara
Ellison late Barbara Mills Widow and relict of
the aforesaid James Mills Dead by the Commissioners
appointed by the County Court of Montgomery Fig. 3
the part conveyed to James Berry by the said James
Mills Dead - In obedience to an order of the County
Court of Montgomery to us directed after being sworn
me the undersigned Commissioners in pursuance of said
order met at the house of Stephen Ellison on the

Barbara Ellison his wife late Barbara Mills
Widow and Relict. of said James Mills Dead her
Right of dower of certain tract of land Granted to
James M^o Millin and by him conveyed to James
Mills Dead containing as appears by the Grant to
said M^o Millin to be 316 acres as shown in the
surveyed plat by the letters A B C D - 156 acres of
which the said James Mills ^{was} seized and possessed
of at his death that part of the said 156 acres
we have allotted to said Stephen Ellison and Barbara
his wife as shown in the annexed plat by the Fig.
1 and contains by survey 60 acres and bounded as
follows (to wit) Beginning at a birch on the
bank of the Creek Corner to James Berry on
the old line thence Running N 20° E 1/2 pole to a
stake in the old line thence N 70° W 116 poles
