John Williamson the 11th day of June 1813 desired me to write his will which promised to do as well as I could. He then told me he wished that such Hall should have his share & his wife Polly Williamson should have all the balance of his Estate (after his debts were paid) which consisted of twelve or thirteen notes of fifteen Dollars each which were given to him to raise a loan of Duty in the late campaign under General Grant now in the hands of William Hall for safe keeping.
