In the name of God Amen the Knight day of May 1831
 Thomas Rapp and wife Mary Rapp of said County and
 Montgomery do make this my last will and testament at the
 same time utterly revoking all former will made by me
 enclosing this to be my last will and testament that I give to my
 lawful wife Mary Rapp that she and her heirs in charging the
 same on her own property with her own sufficient to support
 it I also will take, fully, fully, fully, and leave to be her
 among her widow head with fully of my right to be
 her full share and her interest to be equally divided
 among my Brother William Rapp and also to her the Rapp
 have share and hold. Thus I have this day of my
 the husband of my wife. Secondly I give to my Son John
 Rapp and five others in care he comes and make
 of it - having given him his full share before
 finally - I give to my daughter Mary Rapp the other
 also a Negro Girl fully about twelve years old
