We the subscribers appointed by the Montgomery County Court at their
March Term 1819, as commissioners to settle with James Barclay in his
character as administrator of the estate of Benjamin Tompkins deceased, having exam-
ined all the legal vouchers in relation thereto. Report that the last of
purpise sold of the estate of Benjamin Tompkins deceased amounted to £
16 10/6 of which Henry Sewster became purchaser to the amount of £10 10/6
and will hold to the amount of £2 10/6 each had as appears to our satis-
faction together with his securities for the payment of the same
reported from this commission to the County Court to said
Administrator before he could have collected the same by law or other
means which said £2 10/6 was bought by said Henry Tompkins the man
of said Benjamin Tompkins which to the £2 10/6 bought by said Will
amounts to £2 10/6. which deducted from the above £16 10/6 leaves
a balance of £14 0/6 equal to 94 1/2 p. cent. We report further that
the legal vouchers presented to said Administrator to be paid and by
him discharged out of the funds of said estate amount to \$1144 92 which
deducted from the above \$16 75 leaves a balance due by the
said Administrator of \$98 40. We further report that the said
James Barclay has been at great trouble and expense in collecting
and transmitting the claims of Administrator to the estate of
Benjamin Tompkins deceased for which we have made him no
allowance, except the cost of the funds of said estate all of which is now
fully submitted signed
