I Dawson Black last of Montgomery County and State of Kentucky being Weak in body but of sound mind and memory do make and declare this to be my last will and testament. First I demand my due to the thoughtless who gave me just execution. Secondly that my body may be decently interred. then I leave the means that shall be thought proper as my executor as who may act as such to follow my further instructions. that is at my death as to soon after as the nature of the law will permit out of the estate and estate that I may be allowed of to pay also my just debts and funeral expenses. and then if my wife Rachel Wade shall be living to carry out in her hands the business of my estate to be by her own use of (the whole part of it may be necessary for the support keeping and maintenance of her my wife during her life and after her death and her body decently entombed her funeral expenses I also give thereof then I leave ten dollars of my estate yet remaining it to be equally divided amongst my children all I have and shall have that may be then living son, Dawson Black, James Black, Joseph Black, M^{rs} Black, Esther Black late Esther Wade Elizabeth Jane late Elizabeth Wade, Mary Ann late Mary Ann Wade, Rachel Abner late Rachel Wade, Nancy Abner late Nancy Wade and it is to be understood as a just debt against me at my death for Thomas Abner who made peace for the same has and will keep me and my wife also if we should remove to any of the other children for them to be paid also for such keeping but if it shall please God that I should live so long that I may not at my death have as much to do after my other debts and I am full of years being paid as men live

me for keeping me and my wife in that case for what may be to be equally divided in payment in proportion to the different demands that may be against me for keeping but I do my request and directions. And I do hereby appoint my son-in-law Thomas Abner as my executor as being my son-in-law and the 10th June 1819.
