and thirteen I Richard Jones of the County of Montgomery

my soul to God who gave it nothing doubting that at the
River of God at the general Resurrection I shall raise
again - and as for my body I commend it to the Earth
to be buried in a decent Christian manner at the dis
cretion of my Executors and as to my worldly Estate I give and
bequeath the same in manner and form following

I) I have signed and bequeathed to my son Mathew Jones the plantation
 taken on and the building the hundred acres and fifty acres to
 him for his use except the main house and all the
 out houses and spring. I give and bequeath to my loving wife
 Anne Jones as long as she live and at her death, to be the
 sole property of the above named Mathew Jones. It is also
 my will that my loving wife Anne Jones shall be a sole prop-
 erty during her natural life out of the profits of my land
 and I have signed and bequeathed unto my loving wife Anne
 Jones my negro man & children, as long as she live, but it is
 my will that many years after my decease of the said
 negro shall pay unto my wife Anne Jones the hundred
 dollars he shall be in arrears and at the death of said negro
 shall be paid to my wife Anne Jones, that at the death of my
 wife she shall be sold for what he shall be worth living and after
 many equally divided among my legal heirs. I have signed and
 bequeathed unto my loving wife Anne Jones all my
 stock of Horses Cattle and sheep and all the all my farming
 utensils during her natural life and at her death to
 return to my son Mathew Jones except a Bay Horse called
 Bullion and Womans Saddle and bridle, a Bull Bearded
 and for me to my loving daughter Phillis Jones and
 also except a Bay Horse known by the name of Jannet Stone I
 give and bequeath to my son James Jones to him and to his
 heirs. I have signed and bequeathed unto my loving wife Anne Jones
 all the balance of my household furniture during her natural
 life, and at her death to return to my son Mathew Jones to
 him and his heirs forever. I have signed and bequeathed unto my
 loving daughter Margarette Poynter for free Willing to her and to
 her heirs. I have signed and bequeathed to my loving daughter
 Mary Phillips for free Willing, to her and to her heirs forever and
 lastly of all I appoint my friend Robert Hickory and
 John Haze my whole and sole Executors of this my
 last will and testament as witness my hand and seal
