

Articles of agreement entered into between the heirs of
Arthur Conley dec'd and the heirs taking into consideration
the inconvenience of dividing the slaves belonging to the estate
do agree on the following terms, to wit, we agree to divide or
make a division by lot there not being a negro for each of the
heirs that if the one that falls to either by lot, the other shall be
worth more than my part of the slaves then we are bound to
pay to the other heir whatever the commissioners shall value
the lot at after retaining the amount that shall be due
under either of us in the valuation of the negroes belonging
to the estate of Arthur Conley dec'd and it is further understood
between the parties that a credit of twelve months shall be
given to one half of the cash that shall be paid as in
within one half and two years for the other half as witnesses
and request the commissioners appointed by the County
Court of Montgomery to divide the estate of Arthur Conley
dec'd and to make the division agreeable to this agreement
given under our hands and seals this 26th day of April 1818

I James Carrington of Montgomery County and
State of Kentucky being in a state of bodily infirmity
but sound in mind and memory do hereby declare
and ordain this my last will and testament
revoke all others. I then give and bequeath
to my Dear Beloved wife, Milly Carrington one
third part of my Property both real and personal
during her natural life or widowhood —
I then give and bequeath unto my son John Carrington
and Samuel Carrington all that tract or parcel
of Land whereon I now live, containing one hundred
and forty four acres deeded from George M. Higgins
to me, it is further my will and desire that in case
either of my sons John or Samuel should die without
a lawful heir that the whole of the land shall belong
to the survivor. I do give and bequeath unto my son
John Carrington one negro Boy Peter John and his
heirs forever. I then give and bequeath unto my daughter
Pamella Carrington one negro Boy named George
and Horry which is called Selam to her and her heirs
forever. I then give and bequeath unto my daughter
Elizabeth Haywood one hundred Dollars in cash when
and how she shall please. I then it is my further will
and desire that my beloved wife Milly and my son
John Carrington and Samuel Carrington shall have all
the farming utensils together with my two oxen and four
two work Horses that is a Bay mare and a Sorrel Mare
for the use of the farm and in case of the decease or
marriage of my wife Milly Carrington, it is then my
will and desire that my two sons John and Samuel
shall have the whole of my farming utensils together with
the oxen and cart of the two Mares above mentioned
I then give and bequeath unto my five children Thomas
Carrington Randolph Carrington Timothy Carrington Susan
Hoffman & Sarah M. Carrington all the balance of my

my Property not otherwise Bequeathed, to be equally
divided among them & their heirs forever

 Secondly I do give and bequest to my beloved wife Mary Selly all my Estate real and personal during her natural life or widowhood and at the expiration of her life, or widowhood, my said Estate is to be divided in manner and form as follows to wit
 I do give and bequest to my Daughters Polly and Betsey each of them a horse saddle and bridle to be worth one hundred Dollars and to each of them a hen and rook and furniture and barnyard and to each of them fifty Dollars in cash
 I do give and bequest to my Daughters Jane Rebecca and Sally fifty Dollars each I do give and bequest to my sons Thomas Selly, William Selly, and Charles Selly, five Dollars each
 I do give and bequest to my son Sadron Selly one horse to be worth seventy Dollars
 I do give and bequest to my sons, John Selly and Robert Selly all that may remain of my Estate either Real and Personal, after the several legacies before mentioned shall have been paid, to them their heirs executors forever
 And lastly I do constitute and appoint my said sons John Selly and Robert Selly my Executors to this my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 13th day of October in the year of Lord 1818
