 Estate of Samuel Case deceased to wit

 One gig and harness @ 65 00
 Six Beds and Bedsteads and furniture 50 00
 One Bivouac 18 00
 One spinning wheel @ 3 00
 One Counterpane 5 00
 Six Table Cloth 5 00
 One small Table 1 50
 Three Chairs 1 50
 7 1/2 yards of full cloth 11 25
 One Bottle seven pkts & tea spoons
 and one tea Canister and hammer
 One paper box and six mag giter 2 00
 One Bible and Hymn Book 1 00
 One Iron shovel one Skillett one oven
 one flat iron 2 Crocks 11 25
 One Side saddle 10 00
 So money in hand 87 75
 One note on Asad Foster payable
 on the first day of March next the amount 300 00
 one note on John and Theophilus Case
 payable on the first day of March
 next the amount 150 50

Do one note on George Case payable
 on the first day of May next part
 to the amount of 60 00
 One note on Thomas Moore payable
 on the tenth day of March next
 the amount 22 50
 One note on Dr Peter Bristol
 payable on the fifth day of May
 last part the amount of 8 00
 One pocket Book at 50
