 Montgomery and State of Kentucky being dead in Body and
 considering the uncertainty of this mortal life, best of solemn
 and perfect Memory bequeath be bequeath to the same de-
 make and publish this my last will and testament, in manner and
 form following that is to say I give and bequeath unto my beloved
 wife Elizabeth Bridge during his life the Farm whereon I now
 live with the Farming utensils with my household and kitchen
 furniture. And if after my debt is discharged then I should be enough
 of property left I also give to her the slave named Jane the North
 Horse two Watch Dogs, a Sufficiency of hay for her family consump-
 tion for the year year with the Breeding Corn and then I give to
 her and to hold for her term and present family, & present uses
 and benefit only excepting as much profit from the farm as
 will defray the expenses of the said wife which may be or is now
 demanded against the estate I hold said farm under and what
 money may be necessary to teach my youngest son school and other
 Reading and Writing and arithmetic as far as through the Rules
 of time, as to all the Rest Residue and remainder of my estate
 real and personal estate money goods and chattels of whatever
 and nature soever except my debt in the form of mortgage by which
 I order and draw upon my executor hereafter to be named but
 not to carry the same away in my name of bequeath and
 the money thus received to be put to the use of discharging my
 present debt to be equally divided between my children the above
 named farm with its appurtenances home hold and kitchen
 furniture Farming utensils with the Watch Dogs may be left after
 the death of my wife Elizabeth I order to be sold to the highest bidder
 at Public Auction and the money thus arising after all my
 charges paid to be equally divided between my children or their heirs
 and I do hereby appoint two of my sons William Bridge and
 John Bridge of this my last will and testament hereby Revoking
 all former Wills by me made in Witness whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand and seal this 5th day of February in the year of our
 Lord 1829 Test
