181 George Pugh and William Manly did on the
 day of February in the year of our thousand eight hundred
 and thirtieth at camp at the foot of the Medicine Rocks
 hide Thomas Oakley a private in Captain Pugh's company
 when in a severe indisposition of body but of good mind and
 memory that had no hopes of recovering from his present
 sickness and he wished his property disposed of in the
 following manner to wit: a note he held against James
 Johnson for \$50 he wished ~~that~~ ^{Isabel} Parker to have
 the benefit of and he also wished ~~Isabel~~ ^{Isabel} Parker to collect
 the money due on another note which he ~~held~~ ^{held} against James
 Johnson and pay his debts to wit John Jones and ^{retain} ~~Wm~~
 Boyd their demands and ~~retain~~ the balance for himself and
 the money due him for his services he wished ~~Isabel~~ ^{Isabel} Parker
 to receive and keep the same for his own ^{own} benefit and thereupon
 with the accountants which he has in camp he wished
~~Isabel~~ ^{Isabel} Parker to have and a black brown horse which he
 has in Kentucky he wished ~~Isabel~~ ^{Isabel} Parker to have if he
 needed him and the clothing that he has in camp he wished
~~Isabel~~ ^{Isabel} Parker to have he wished a sword which he had
 given to little Billy Oakley not to be taken away from
 him and he wished Captain Pugh to write an order for ~~Isabel~~
 Parker on David Allen who has the above mentioned
 notes in possession for them. And further respecting the

 Joel Parker produced the will and bonds signed
 instrument of writing to the Court purporting to be the non-
 cupative will of Thomas Oakley Deceased and the same was

 But for reasons appearing to the Court they would not admit the
 will or Record at this Court but ordered the same to be continued
 until the next Court And at a Court held for Bath County on
 on the 15th day of June 1813 The Depositions of George
 Pugh and William Maury was purporting to be the noncupative
 will of Thomas Oakley Deceased being produced at last Court and
 for cause shown continued until the present term and there
 now being no objections made it is ordered that the same be
 recorded according to Law
