 of writing my last Will and Testament to John Hardwick my

 mediation of Jesus Christ - Secondly, As to my worldly goods, I
 will and bequeath to Thomas Wm Hardwick (infant son of John
 Hardwick Jr) all and singularly my real and personal estate
 except an pound or more money which I will and bequeath to
 Julia Christwick infant daughter of John Hardwick Jr.
 Lastly, I constitute and appoint John Hardwick my Executor.
 In testimony, whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
 this 6th day of August 1860. The word state, between lines
