Item I give and bequeath to my children, John, Magdalene, Mary, Peter, Stephen, Jane, Charles, Daniels and Martha, the property I have heretofore given them, both of what kind soever, with this increase, to them and their heirs forever. Now it is my desire that my interest in the salt works tract of land in the state of Kentucky be divided into sixteen equal shares, and to each of my children, John, Magdalene, Mary, Stephen, Jane, Charles, Martha and Daniel, I give and bequeath one and a half share to them and their heirs forever. To my two grand children, Henry & Guerrant, and Martha Guerrant, in equal proportion one and a half shares of the said tract of land, and the sum of one thousand dollars in money. But if either of them die before they attain the age of twenty one years, or before they have children the remainder to the survivor of them, or the children of the survivor and if both die without children before the age of twenty one years, remainder to my children aforesaid their heirs & aforesaid forever. Said grand children aforesaid to be children of my deceased son William Greenbank - To my son Peter I give and bequeath the remaining two and a half shares in the salt works tract of land in the state of Kentucky to him his heirs and aforesaid forever. My will and desire is that all the residue of my estate be sold by my executors over twelve months credit and the money arising therefrom, of all other monies belonging to me be divided as follows: First, tenth equally between my nine children and their heirs, and the remaining tenth, to my two grand children aforesaid, with remainder as aforesaid and my three sons in law Thomas Allosley, Charles Glover

and James Anderson executors of this my last will and testament with full power to appoint one or more agents to transact business for them in the state of Virginia, such as relate to the execution of this will. In testimony whereof I have hereunto affixed my hand and seal the twentieth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventeen.
