In the name of God Amen I William Rogers citizen of
Montgomery County State of Kentucky do make and constitute
and ordain this instrument of writing to be my last will
and testament being of sound mind and disposing memory
First all those debts which are justly due at the time of
my decease are to be properly adjusted and paid by my
Executors hereafter named as speedily as practicable.

Then I will devise and bequeath to my dear & beloved wife
Mary one third part of the land and Negroes I may be pos-
sessed of at the time of my decease the one third part of
the number of acres of my land ^{to be} in one piece in a
good form and the part she may choose also her choice of
one third part of my Negroes having regard to value to
be by her freely possessed and enjoyed during the term of
her natural life also one third part of my personal estate
to be disposed of by her absolutely and as she shall see cause.

Then I will devise and bequeath to my sons Peter and Rogers the
Rogers Thomas Rogers and James Rogers the sum of ten dollars
each to be in full of their parts of my estate as I have made
considerable advancements to them. My Executors hereafter
named are authorized to sell the remaining two thirds
of my land in such parcels and in such order as they

may deem proper and most advantageous and my said
Executors or such of them as may be living or acting under
this my last will and testament to convey my title
to the purchaser with such clause of warranty as they may
deem best also the remaining two thirds of my negroes and
personal estate is to be sold by my executors on such credit
as they may deem most advantageous to my children and
after paying my daughter Nancy and my son William six
hundred dollars each out of the money my negroes may
sell for the money my land may sell for to be equally
divided between my children Lucy Duncan Betty Young
Nancy Rogers and William Rogers and the balance of ^{money} ~~the~~
arising from the sale of my negroes and personal estate
together with two thirds of the money I may have or
be owing to me at the time of my decease to be equally
divided among my children John Rogers Lucy Duncan
Betty Young Nancy Rogers and William Rogers.
And after the death of my dearly beloved wife Betty
my executors or executors or such as may be acting
and authorizing and directing to sell and convey my title of my
wife third part of my land either in parts or together
as may suit with such clause of warranty as they may
deem best also my wife third part of my negroes on such
credit or credit as they may deem most advantageous.
And the one half of the money arising from the sale
of my wife third part of my negroes and the whole
money arising to be equally divided between my ^{two} grand
children William Rogers and Julia Rogers children of
Paris Rogers deceased to be paid to them by Executors when
they arrive at the age twenty one year or get married.

Item The remaining half of the price of my wife third part
of my negroes and the whole of the money arising from
the sale of my wife third part of my land I will devise
and bequeath to my son John Rogers my Daughter Lucy Duncan
Betty Young Nancy Rogers and William Rogers to be equal-
ly divided between them to them and their heirs forever.
Now if either my Daughter Nancy or my son William shall
depart this life before they arrive at the age of twenty one years
or have a lawful heir by their body begotten the share or shares
of one or both of them should both depart this life before they
attain the age of twenty one years or have a lawful child or
children to be equally divided between my children John Lucy
Nancy Betty and William or such of them as may be living
or if either of them be dead and leave a child or children
then the child or children to receive the part their deceased
parent would be entitled to. Now if either of my grand
children William Rogers or Julia Rogers should depart
this life without a lawful heir by their own body begotten
and living at the time of their death the proportion or
part of the deceased to go to the surviving brother or sister as the
case may be but if both my said grand children should depart
this life without leaving a child by their body lawfully begotten
then then the legacy bequeathed to them to be equally divided
between my children John Lucy Nancy Betty and William
or such of them as may be living or if either of them be dead
and leave a child or children then the child or children
to receive the part their deceased parents should
be entitled to. Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my
friends Nicholas Lafon Saml C Williams and David Paul executors
of this my last will and testament In testimony whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 2 day of Feb 1817.
