At a Court held for Montgomery County on the 6th day of January 1757 This Instrument of writing purporting to be the last will and testament of Archibald M^r Henry deceased was produced here & sworn by the oaths of John B^r Duke Gabriel Hughes witnesses thereto made to be recorded and at the same Court on the second succeeding day Elizabeth M^r Henry the Executrix therein named made oath according to law & no bond was given agreeably to the provision of said act the same is duly recorded.

In the name of James William Smith & Montgomery County and of the County of Kent by being sworn & by the oath of conscience and perfect mind and memory Charles Smith being first sworn to do so do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following (that is to say) I do give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary C^r Smith the plantation whereon I now live together with twenty one acres of land to include the plantation whereon I now live and bounded as follows Beginning at a hickory and sugar tree on a rise come to a lot of fifty acres land of James Smiths daughter to my son Daniel

town line thence north five degrees East with the town line to a hickory in the line of John Brown passing his corner on hundred and ninety three poles thence and so on to the beginning to be a part of it what time and in what manner she shall think proper to my son Robert Smith and ^{Elizabet} Smith their heirs and assigns. Also I give to my above mentioned wife all my moveable property to be disposed of as she shall think fit to my daughter Sarah Brown Elizabeth M^r Henry Nancy Smith and Lydia Smith. Also I give and bequeath to my above mentioned wife all my town land to be disposed of as she shall think proper except one acre for siting a house on the main street and on the north side thereof between my house and John M^r Henry lot which were to be legally conveyed to the first church of a Unitarian by my Executor when called on by the church. Also I give and bequeath to my son George Smith his heirs and assigns fifty acres of land in the southwest corner of my tract whereon I now live. To begin at a corner and hence south and so on to North five degrees East to a certain corner to Emek Smiths thence South Eighty five degrees East one hundred five and a half poles to another corner of said Emek Smiths thence at right angles to the original line of Emek Smiths precept and with the same to the beginning. Also I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Frances Smith daughter of my son Daniel Smith fifty acres of land to include the plantation whereon I now live. Beginning at an old stone house near the road and extending south five degrees west and so on to a hickory and sugar tree thence at right angles and so on from each end of the line for quantity, ending on Emek Smiths line for quantity to her and her heirs together with forty dollars that she has received for rent and all the rents arising from the same until she shall marry or come of age. Whereas I have formally given to my son William Smith fifty acres of land in the north west corner of my tract whereon I now live. I give that as his portion for life. Also I give and bequeath to my son Henry Smith his heirs and assigns twenty acres of land to begin at a corner to Smiths tract

South East corner to Enoch Smiths preemption and extending North
 eighty five degrees west ninety six poles with the original
 Preemption line to a forked white oak on the north side of a branch then
 at right angles from each end of this line to bind on the town
 lands and the lot I have upon for quantity. Also I give and bequeath
 to my son Enoch Smith his heirs and assigns forty five acres of land
 of land to begin at the above mentioned forked white oak and
 extending North Eighty five degrees west with the original preemption
 line ninety six and a half poles to stake thence North west from
 each end of the line for the quantity at right angles to come on
 my son Henry Smiths lot and lot to him in I live and lastly
 I give and bequeath to my son John Smith his heirs and assigns all the
 land lying between my son George Smiths lot and my son Enoch
 Smiths lot and from the confidence that I repose in my beloved
 wife together with my son Enoch and John Smiths appoint
 her as Executrix together with them as Executors of this my
 last will & testament hereby revoking all former wills by me
