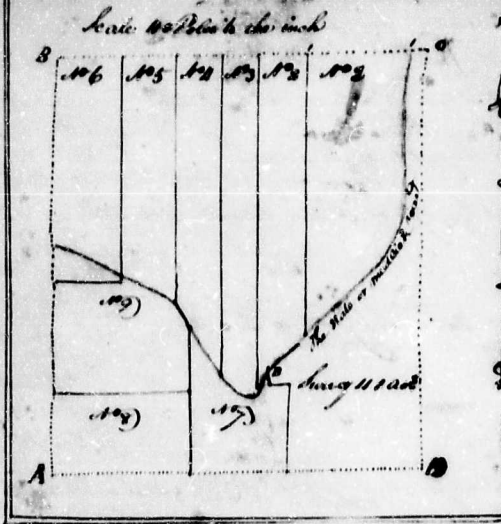

5th 1823 and ending August 5th 1824 (1823) From my
Report made August the 4th 1823 it will appear that
I have in my hands on that day in commonwealth
Bank Notes one thousand & six Dollars fifty one cents
and half cents 1006 51 1/2
Interest until 1st of August 1824 60 39
Booths is now & has been 100 per cent 1006 91 1/2
which would in never only 60 and half that sum
Received for Rent on 4th March last \$20 Credit to me 20
I had sum in my hands on 5th August 1824 \$1088 00
From which sum the following Disbursements
are to be deducted

Surveyed for the heirs of William Deceased on the 20th day of April 1821 by virtue of an order from the Washington Co. County Court of Maryland, and by order of the said Commissioners the said appointed Court Marshal & Clerk John James and Clement

James Esquire, who attended at the same time at the house of the widow of the Deceased and after having duly examined the quantity of the land to be divided between the representatives heirs first directed me to lay off 41 acres including the mansion house as near to the surviving widow which is represented on the plat on the East side of the Survey and bounded on the East by the East line of the original survey and on the South by the South line of the same and on the West by the lines of lot No. 7 and the great road and on the North by the North boundary line. I then laid off lot No. 1 Beginning at the great road figure 1 and run West 164 poles to a stake on Morgan Station line, thence South 120 poles to a stake in the great road, thence with the meanders of the great road to the beginning containing 27 acres - I then laid off lot No. 2 beginning at the N. W. corner of lot No. 1 running West 20 poles to a stake a corner marked as so pointed, thence South 160 poles to a stake in the great road, thence with the meanders of the great road to the S. W. corner of lot No. 1 thence North 120 poles to beginning containing 16 acres - I then laid off lot No. 3 beginning at the N. W. corner of lot No. 2 and ran West 16 poles to a stake right a square and ran thence South 187 poles to a stake in the great road thence with the meanders of the great road to the S. W. corner of lot No. 2 thence

North 140 poles to the beginning containing 16 acres, I then laid off lot No. 4 beginning at the S. W. corner of lot No. 3 and ran West 20 poles to a stake right a square, thence South 104 poles to a stake in the great road, thence with the meanders of the great road to the S. W. corner of lot No. 3 thence North 137 poles to the beginning containing 15 acres - I then laid off lot No. 5 beginning at the S. W. corner of lot No. 4 and ran West 23 poles to a stake, thence South 90 poles to a stake in the great road thence with the meanders of the great road to the S. W. corner of lot No. 4 thence North 104 poles to the beginning containing 18 acres - I then laid off lot No. 6 beginning at the S. W. corner of lot No. 5 and ran West 29 poles to the S. W. corner of the Survey and corner to Thomas Samson, thence South 760 poles crossing the great road to a stake in Samson's line, thence East 29 poles to a stake corner to lot No. 7 thence North 70 poles to the beginning containing 18 acres, I then laid off lot No. 7 by beginning at the most Westwardly corner of the answer last right the mansion house and ran S. to 16 poles thence South 47 poles to a stake close by the orchard fence, thence South 34 poles to a stake in the South line of the Survey and corner to the answer last, thence West with the original line 23 poles to a stake corner to lot No. 8 thence North 58 poles to a stake in the great road thence with the meanders of the great road to the beginning containing 18 acres, I then laid off lot No. 8 beginning at the S. W. corner of lot No. 7 and ran West 60 poles to the corner of the original survey at the letter A on the plat, thence North 25 poles to a stake in the West line, thence East 60 poles to intersect the West line of lot No. 7 thence South 36 poles to the beginning containing 12 acres and lastly I laid off lot No. 9 beginning at the S. E. corner of lot No. 8 and extending North with the line of lot No. 7, 22 poles to the great road thence with the meanders of the great road to intersect the East line of lot No. 8 thence South 60 poles to the S. E. corner of lot No. 8 thence West 29 poles to the S. W. corner of lot No. 8 thence South 80 poles to the S. W. corner of lot No. 8 thence East 60 poles to the beginning containing 16 acres
