Lane one Feather bed and Furniture together with writing Desk at his mother's
Death or at any time in her life time when she pleases to give them up
to him I further give and devise to my son Hiram Lane his share and
part of all my (Mesage and Tenement of Land containing one hundred
Acres situate lying and being in the state of Kentucky on the waters of
Springston in the County of Montgomery town, the Hundred Acres of Land
whereon I now live, I also give to my several Daughters hereafter named in
addition to what I have already given them to wit, my Daughter Amy
Shuman Lane who married William Higgins - and my Daughter the
Smith Lane who married James Trimble - and my daughter Somner
Maddy Lane who married George Cook and my Daughter Elizabeth Lane
who married John Meade and my daughter Mary Anne Lane who married
William Grinstead and my Daughter Sarah Lane who married George Priest
Equal Division of all my Personal Property remaining after my lawful debts
are paid at their mother's death which Division my wife is shall be made by
my son Hiram Lane within six months after his mother's death after I do hereby
appoint my sole Executor without giving security of this my last Will and
Testament hereby Revoking all former Wills by me made In witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 15th November in the year of
our Lord 1822

Blyer a negro boy by the name of Frederick - 4th I will and bequeath to my Dau-
ghter Elizabeth Means a negro boy by the name of Robert, provided my said
Daughter will relinquish the Debt of gift I made her to a negro boy named
Washington which Debt of gift is on record in Montgomery County Court
Clerks office - 5th I will and bequeath to my youngest son Hiram Wyatt
a negro woman named Phillis and her child by the name of Dallas also I
will and bequeath to my said son Hiram the negro boy named Washington
provided my aforesaid daughter Elizabeth Means should relinquish the
aforesaid Debt of gift I give her. If not I will and bequeath my aforesaid
said son Hiram the negro boy Robert - 6th My Will is that my two Daughters
only Fort and Malinda Holms have no more of my estate having heretofore
given them their full share of my estate - 7th I will and bequeath to my
Daughter Nancy Hawks five dollars in addition to what I heretofore let her
husband Samuel Hawks have - Also I will and bequeath to my son Hiram
Wyatt one hundred and fifty Acres of land Off of my three hundred
Acre Survey whereon I now live including the plantation and premises Begun
running at the center of the south boundary line of said three hundred
Acre Survey and running North to the north boundary line of the same
I also will and bequeath to my said son Hiram two horses one named
Gray Robin and the other named Jim, also two Cows his choice out of my
stock, also two bearshear Plows and two pair of gear, also one linen shed
one Chest, two tables and a side board, three Sittles, two ten gallon
Sittles and one sixteen gallon Sittle - also six ewes his choice out of my
flock of sheep one bed and furniture, one headstall and a Cord - 8th
I will and bequeath to my two sons Francis and William one hundred
and fifty Acres of land the east end of my three hundred and

adjoin the one hundred and fifty which I have Will'd above to my son that
to be equally divided between my said two sons Francis and William, and
by Will is that the tract of land whereon William's place now lies be sold and
the money equally divided between my two sons Douglass, John, Anthony Fran-
cis and William - also my Will is that all my stock of any complexion, that I
have not here disposed of, be sold also all the corn and grain of every complexion
except sixty barrels of Corn which I reserve for my son Haden - also my Will
is that my negro man Moses be hired out for six years and the money arising
therefrom to go to the use and benefit of my two sons Douglass and William -
also my Will is that I do bequeath three hundred Acres of land lying in the State of
Virginia being a part of my Spanish grant of eight hundred Acres to my
two sons Douglass and William to be equally divided the two, - also my Will
is that my negro woman Hester be free at my Death - also my Will is that my
negro man Moses be set at liberty after the term of six years above mentioned
have expired and that my son Haden be appointed guardian for said negro
man Moses to see that Justice be done said negro man - also my Will is
that my Clerk be called Lastly, I appoint my son Haden Ryall and J. B.
Cress Executors to this my last Will and Testament Witness my hand and
seal this 11th day of February 1821, -
