I James Davis of the County of Montgomery, and State
 of Kentucky. Being of sound mind, and now sick
 and confined to my bed, and supposing my dis-
 position cannot be very distant, and being desirous
 that my estate should be disposed of in such way,
 as is most agreeable to my own mind, I make and
 ordain this my last will and testament as follows
 (to wit)

To my son Samuel Davis I give and bequeath one thou-
 sand Dollars, Gold or Silver — and also my riding mare.
 To my grand son, James Davis McBlair, five hundred
 dollars Gold or Silver, to be kept at interest by my executor
 hereafter named, untill my said grandson shall choose
 a guardian, and then to be paid over to such guardian,
 both principal and interest, and in case my said grand
 son should die, before he arrives to the age of twenty
 one years, then the aforesaid five hundred dollars
 and the accruing interest, to be equally divided am-
 ong his sisters, my grand daughter.

To my grand son, James Davis Matur, five hundred
 dollars Gold or Silver, to be paid to his father as natural
 guardian to my said grand son James Davis Matur
 to be kept at interest till my said grand son

shall choose a guardian
 and interest, the said grand son, should he die, before he arrives to the age of twenty one
 years, then the said five hundred dollars with the accruing
 interest to be equally divided between his Brothers and
 sisters, my grand children.

To my Daughter Sarah Matur I give and bequeath
 gold or silver and also my chest my principal
 five hundred dollars to each of my grand
 is that they may receive an education,
 parents will permit them to be sent to school
 that any part or all the accruing interest
 legacy of five hundred dollars should be expended
 education. And provides the parents of said grand
 let them be sent to school, then the respective legacies
 to go and decend, as first aforesaid directed.
 I hereby authorize, and direct my Executor hereafter
 to lay out one thousand dollars, in notes of the Bank of the
 commonwealth, in the purchase of land, in such place as my
 son John Davis and my Executor shall select for a place of resi-
 dence for my said son John Davis, his wife and children and
 and the title on deed for said land, to be made to my
 grand children, the sons, and daughters of my sons, the said
 John Davis. And my son John and his wife, to have the privilege
 to reside on, and occupy the said land, during their natural
 lives, and the natural life of the survivor of them free from
 rent or damages.

I give my wagon and gear, and my Farming utensils to my son
 Josiah Davis. My man Thom, and free man and
 declare him to be at full and entire liberty from the claim,
 and authority of my heirs forever. I give my bed and furniture,
 to my grand daughter Betsey Davis, eldest daughter
 of my son Josiah Davis. I give all the residue of my estate to my
 son and daughters and two grand sons equally that I do
 ray to the five daughters of my daughter Tolera
 McBlair, and the two eldest sons and two daughters, of
 my Daughter Sarah Matur and the three daughters of my
 son Josiah Davis. To be kept at interest, and paid to
 my said grand daughter, and grand sons as they shall
 respectively arrive at age or marry. And lastly I appoint
 my son Josiah Davis, Executor of this last will, and testament
 in testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand, and
 affixed my seal, this first day of October 1826
