That James Nelson sold property to the amount of \$65.00
in commonwealth paper - The said James also
in specie - He paid an execution to the amount of \$144.14
in specie - He paid other debts to the amount of \$76.00
in commonwealth paper - & we allow him \$35.00
in specie for his services as agent - and after deducting
from what he has paid the sum which he has now due
find that the estate is in debt to the sum of \$57.07 1/2
in specie - and \$5.50 cents in commonwealth paper

Coons vs. William Coons & James Nelson being first duly

of said debt up to the 1st day of April 1826 -
for \$75.00 in specie for which he is charged
