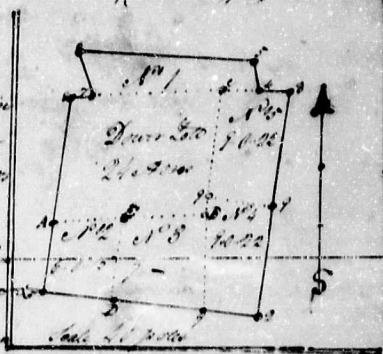

 Susanna Davis by beginning at a stake in spring line at the
 fig 8 in plat and run N 87° E 38 poles to a stake at C thence
 S 10° W 55 poles to a stake at D thence N 71° W 68 poles to
 intersect spring line at A thence with spring line to the
 line of the survey to the Beginning containing 24 acres
 I was then directed to lay off 24 acres of land
