The Deposition of Polly Martin the Adversary of William Case was this day produced in court. "The Deposition of Polly Martin the Adversary of William Case gave the following Deposition. - "On the day that William Case was taken ill after he was taken very bad William Case said to the Deponent for this Deposition, and when she was in the house he told her that he expected he was going to die and he wanted her and Mrs Betty Davis to know what he wished his wife Polly Case to have of his property in case he should die. "The said William Case then told the Deposition and Mrs Davis that he wished his wife Polly Case to have his mare and a bridle and her side saddle, and one chair because of her "chills and that he wished the other two chairs to remain for his two Children. - That the said William Case remained sick, and kept his bed from that time until he died. The above took place about three months ago at William Case our house. The person the Estate of William Case is with now shall take the person the Estate of William Case to the same facts."

It is therefore considered by the court that the same be established as the noncompensable Will of William Case Deceased.
