the County of Washington and State of Kentucky being
weak and sick of body but in perfect mind and
memory blessed be God do constitute this my last will
and Testament in manner and form following
Viz I bequeath my Body to the earth to be interred
with decent burial and as to my worldly goods
I dispose of them in manner and form following
Nam. my will and desire is that all my just debts be paid as soon
as possible after my decease.

Item my will and desire is that my negro boy Daniel be sold
after my decease and my wife Mary Malone have the proceeds
of the sale at her disposal the terms of the sale to rest with my
Executor hereafter named also one negro girl named Mary
I give to my wife Mary Malone during her natural
life and at her decease I give the said negro girl Mary
over to my youngest daughter Leah to her and her heirs for
ever also I give to my wife Mary Malone all my household
and kitchen furniture which I now possess during her natural
life and then to be equally divided among my children
also one large spruce mare I give to my wife known by the
name of Bird to her during her natural life and should my
wife decease before the mare should my desire is that the said

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Mare be sold & the proceeds equally divided among my
children

Now I give to my two Daughters now single viz
Ruth Malone & Leah Malone one horse each saddle and
one bridle and each one feather bed and furniture
the best furniture now attolled for them and the
horse beasts to be worth at least fifty dollars each. My wife
Mary Malone having the right of choosing first and
Ruth the second and Leah the third the choice
choiced the balance of my estate I give to be sold at
Publick sale and the proceeds to be equally divided
among all my children my wife and also to that my
wife Mary Malone and said Leah Malone be by their
present appointment Executor and Executrix to this my
last will & Testament revoking all other wills and testaments
heretofore made by me Johnathan Malone in testimony
whereof I the said Johnathan Malone have set my hand

and affixed my seal this twenty seventh day of October in
the year of our Lord
