last will and Testament of the said Joseph Han
deceased and ordered to be recorded and this being
no one entered name in said will on the motion of
Joseph Han Soga who made oath thereto as the same
directs certificate is granted him for obtaining letters
of administration on the estate of the said Joseph
Han deceased with power appraised and who there
upon entered into and acknowledged bond with
James Bonner as his security in the penalty of \$500
himself and all and conditions according to
law whereupon the same is duly entered of the
records.
