 I the John of Amos, Robert Lockridge of the County &
 State aforesaid, being in a low & afflicted condition, flat of
 a sound & disposing mind, do make & appoint this my last will
 & testament in the manner and form following (Wit^{ness}). I will
 that all my lawful Debts be paid out of my personal estate.
 I also will that the fifty acres of land whereon I now live &
 depend on, be by my father to the best advantage, the pro-
 ceeds thereof, with what money I have on hand (except
 five hundred dollars) I appoint to be appropriated to the pur-
 chasing what land it will procure the place to be
 the situation of my wife together with the land of my father

 hold furniture be retained by my wife & children, for
 their use and benefit, except my riding horse, Fox and
