In the afternoon I sat on the 2nd day of November 1825 with the census and knowledge of the parties after being first seen and presence to the propriety of the duties assigned us and do now make the following report that the fine belongs to the State from actual survey made by John W. Bates & Co. 1825 15 poles of land, as per reference to his Plat herewith submitted & the effect of which you will find designated on said Plat by figures 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8. situate and lying near the Town of Mount Airy in which the said Lawrence & Co. now reside, also one other tract or parcel of land within the confines of the town of Mount Airy containing seven & one-half acres lying back of the little Mountain and fronting upon it and known on the map of said Town of 1825 8 part per 100. One half acre lot near Birch ridge on main St and near Sweet Salter known on the map of 1825 47 one half acre lot known adjoining the latter and on main St the late residence of William Broadshaw and lot known by its 18 48 and one lot on high St containing one acre of land inclosed with a fence and known by its 18 48. As making in all 7 1/2 poles of land from which we issued and sold unto Lawrence Davis 2 1/2 acres so as to include the mountain House in which she now lives designated on the Plat A, B, C, D. The balance 5 1/2 poles we parcelled out and among their value in the manner following tract and designated from them as 8 figures - viz -

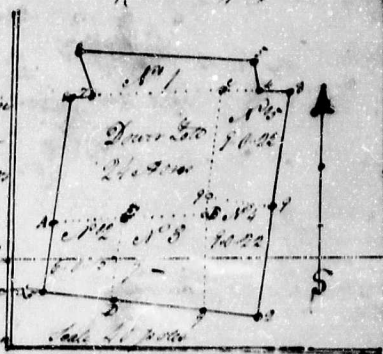
