that I Mary Sadler of the County of Montgomery and State  
of Ky being of sound mind and memory and not knowing of what  
time it may please the Almighty to call me from this world do  
make this my last will and Testament. I do will and bequeath  
all my estate of real and personal to my will beloved grandson Lucien I  
Dumeth which estate consists of the following items of Property to wit  
one negro girl a slave named Cynd about 16 years of age. One cherry  
Dumeth one dressing box of Mahogany one painted bed and bed  
stead and its furniture three split bottomed chairs one looking glass  
one cherry breakfast table one walnut kitchen table kettles etc etc  
Hammers five shovel and five trow with all my kitchen utensils  
Pails Tubs Kys dishes plates knives forks with all the cupboards  
furniture Books &c and do also make and appoint the said  
Lucien I Dumeth the Executor of this my last will and Testament  
do witness my hand and seal this 27 day of January 1826

We the undersigned Commissioners in pursuance of an order  
of the worshipful court of Montgomery County to us directed  
have investigated the accounts of John Sadler Deed as he  
of his father John Sadler some Deed which accounts are in  
the hands of James Mason & Nicholas Hamilton the admin-  
istrators of the several estates of both the Deceaseds and having  
examined the same have to report

That John Sadler of his fathers estate as follows the following  
negro Hans viz  
Nelly value at \$200  
That Do at 150  
Betsy at 575  
Sarah at 550  
Lars at 600  
Ben at 400  
also Harrison  
Minerva  
Maria who  
were born  
of J. Sadler  
ser.

We also find that J. Sadler made distribution of some of his above  
named slaves as follows viz to his mother the widow, Phillis valued  
at \$1320, having given her those two slaves at said valuation as so-  
many dollars of her thirds of the personality.  
2nd That he distributed to Wm Sadler his a negro named Charlotte  
valued at \$500. & that William according to the provisions of the will  
paid John \$156.25 cents having John Deed to the estate on this \$156.25 cents  
& 6c by Charlotte at \$500.  
3rd That John distributed to Ruth Sadler another his a negro girl  
Hannah valued at \$165 & that John according to the provisions  
of the will paid to Ruth Sadler \$178.80 cents leaving him 6c by a  
negro & 25 cents of \$178.80 cents amounting to.  
4th That a negro Sarah was allotted to John himself another  
his & according to the will had to pay \$103.20 cents leaving him  
Deed on this to his father estate \$213.20 cents & 6c by negro Sarah 550  
also 6c by Miffy who died.  
Of the personality We find that he sold of his fathers  
estate as per sale bill \$1702.14 74 cents worth of property.  
And that he recd other property which was not sold but paid  
Said but distributed to the estate to the amount of \$1825 cents  
leaving him Deed on these -  
due to this the amount which John & William paid for the  
supermedium value of their negroes viz to \$156.25 cents by  
William & \$213.20 cents by John & John will be paid to  
his fathers estate on these Deed
