me or owing to me by persons as my last will directs  
may be paid by my executors the other named without necessary  
delay. It is my will and legacy to my children William  
Hasty, Stewart Hasty, James Edward Hasty <sup>and</sup> ~~and~~ the property  
herefore given them whether it may be with its increase to  
them and their heirs forever. And it is my will and desire that  
all my property both personal and real shall remain to my  
widow and will take care of her during her life time or  
otherwise and when she may die or if she should herefore  
leave me more than it is my will and desire that the remainder  
shall be sold by my executors to the highest bidder and  
paid of after months and the foregoing sum payed  
towards among my several children above mentioned to them  
and their heirs forever. It is my will and desire that
